VARC

What is the VARC? Well, it stands for the Valley Amateur Radio Club. Never heard of it? Don't feel bad, most people haven't. The Valley Amateur Radio Club is an organization with no dues, no membership meetings, and really only one requirement for membership. You must have ARRL VE credentials. Now most VARC members are also TCRC members, but that isn't necessary.

The sole function of the VARC is to conduct ARRL sanctioned VE exams. At the present time exams are conducted at the Perkins located on Interstate 35 at exit 85, in Lakeville. This is the same location where the Saturday morning TCRC breakfasts are held. VE exam sessions are on the second Wednesday of every month at 7:00PM. More details regarding the VARC exam sessions may be seen on the web at http://www.qsl.net/varc. Jim Rice, NØOA, is the liaison VE for the Valley VE Team and may be contacted through his TCRC email address (n0oa@tcrc.org) or by telephone at 612-384-7709.

At present a minimum of three VE's are necessary to conduct a session, although this may soon be reduced to two (see page 64 of the December, 2012 issue of QST). Consequently, we are always in need of qualified VEs to help out at exam sessions.

Have you ever given any thought to becoming a VE? It isn't difficult and the exam sessions are a lot of fun. It is also a good way to "give back" to the amateur radio community.

Becoming an ARRL accredited VE is a free and easy three step process. All the details and information needed to complete the process is located on the ARRL web site: http://www.arrl.org/become-an-arrl-ve.
